1. Welcome and Introductions

David Pedersen, chair of the North Santa Monica Bay WASC, called the meeting to order.

All committee members made self-introductions, and quorum was established.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from April 30, 2020

The District provided a copy of the meeting minutes from the previous meeting.

Jessica Forte made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Cung Nguyen seconded the motion. The Committee voted to approve the meeting minutes (Unanimous).

3. Committee Member and District Updates

Kirk Allen provided updates from the District, noting: the Fund Transfer Agreements were approved on June 9 and were distributed to all cities, within the transfer agreement is an annual plan for how each city is planning to utilize the local return; Stormwater Investment Plans (SIPs) have advanced to the Board by the ROC; the SCW GIS tool will be updated to include Caltrans right-of-way.

Dave Rydman noted that the ROC has been meeting to review the SIPs, and additional discussions will be taking place for Disadvantaged Communities.

Madelyn Glickfeld noted that she and David Pedersen has had a meeting with County BOS staff to discuss unique challenges for the NSMB WASC, and stressed the need to collaborate on projects across the various municipalities in the watershed. Heal the Bay has released their annual report with special focus on Topanga canyon.

Jessica Forte has noted that Agoura Hills is exploring a number of projects for their city, and is looking to partner with LA County on their Liberty Canyon project.

4. Public Comment Period

No public comments received.

5. Discussion Items

a) Ex Parte Communications Disclosure

Cung Nguyen confirmed LA County has been working with city of Agoura Hills on a joint project at Liberty Canyon.

b) Status of Applications for Municipalities for the Next Round of Call for Projects

Shea Cunningham and her staff noted that the City of Malibu is currently not planning to submit a project currently for this year due to a number of challenges, chiefly recovery efforts after the latest wildfires.

Joe Bellomo noted that Hidden Hills is looking at a number of projects to submit for the Regional Program for a detention/retention basin.

Alex Farassati noted that projects for city of Calabasas are planned but might not meet the threshold score.

Jessica Forte noted that Agoura Hills is planning a diversion project at the base of Ladera Canyon where a treatment plant was already being planned for this area.

Roxanne Hughes with Westlake Village noted that the city is planning to submit for the Ridgeford project and utilize municipal funding to also help fund this project as well.

Bruce Hamamoto noted that County Unincorporated Area will be resubmitting the Viewridge project for a smaller portion of funding requested to match the UA's proportional benefit. There's also an additional greenstreet project at Liberty Canyon to partner with LACFCD and Agoura Hills to submit one application.

Cung Nguyen noted that LACFCD is also exploring a project in Trancas Canyon for restoration and water quality improvements at that site.

David Pedersen noted that it was critical that all municipalities put forward a project to ensure that something can be presented through the Regional Program, even if the current score might be low. Committee members and the County could help work with applicants to find ways to maximize the score for the projects being submitted.

Mike Antos noted that the County may be exploring a broader definition for water supply, which could eventually help applicants in the NSMB WASC reach that threshold score. Water Supply specifically is a challenge to meet for the watershed.

c) Each Municipality's Plan for the Municipal Program Funding

Shea Cunningham noted that the city of Malibu is planning to use municipal funding to help boost projects proposed in their city.

Alex Farassati noted that the city of Calabasas is planning to use funds on maintenance activities.

Jessica Forte noted that the city of Agoura Hills is planning to use a portion of their municipal funds for street sweeping, scope development for a treatment plant, and additional catch basin insert retrofitting or sewer diversions.

Roxanne Hughes noted that the city of Westlake Village is planning to use funds to pay SIMP cost shares, feasibility study development, and a concept project in the Canyon Oaks area.

Bruce Hamamoto noted that Unincorporated Area is using funds to cover street sweeping and monitoring, with a majority of the municipal funds being used for <u>County</u> local match for <u>their</u> regional projects. Bruce Hamamoto noted that funds for the UA are divided by Supervisorial District in the proportion where funds were collected.

Joe Bellomo noted that the city of Hidden Hills is planning to use municipal return on either existing projects or retrofits, or the city may bank for a larger project.

d) Watershed Coordinator Solicitation & Scope of Work

Kirk Allen provided a summary of the roles that the NSMB WASC committee members would fill in the process to identify their watershed coordinator. Interviews with scripted questions will be held with the committee, and committee members will have their qualifications provided. Committee members will then take a vote and create a ranked list for as many watershed coordinators that are interviewed. The committee discussed potential challenges given that the watershed coordinator for the NSMB WASC will be half time.

i) Caltrans ii) Others

Kirk Allen introduced Tom Rutsch with Caltrans to begin discussions of possible options for cost share in the NSMB WASC. Tom Rutsch noted that Caltrans has its own NPDES permit, noting that their ROW is typically very narrow so there's limitations for where they can do projects. Caltrans has a two-partnership program to help fund projects that would be located off of Caltrans ROW, and would be a great opportunity for the Regional Program for cost shares.

David Pedersen thanked the committee members and public for their time and participation and adjourned the meeting.



Watershed Coordinator Next Steps for WASC




- The Qualified Proposer List will be invited to provide a presentation of their Capabilities and Qualifications (CAQ) to the Watershed Area Steering Committee

Watershed Coordinators Scope of Work




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Conflicts of Interest
