#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

Diane Gatza, Chair of the South Santa Monica Bay WASC, called the meeting to order.

All committee members made self-introductions, and a quorum was established.

### 2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from May 6, 2020

The District provided a copy of the meeting minutes from the previous meeting. Diane Gatza asked the committee members for comments or revisions.

Kristen Ruffell made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Julio Gonzales seconded the motion. The Committee voted to approve the meeting minutes. (unanimous).

#### 3. Committee Member and District Updates

Kirk Allen provided the District update, noting: the Fund Transfer Agreement is on schedule to be approved on June 2 by the Board of Supervisors; and the Watershed Coordinator solicitation will be released on May 26 with a two month review period, and there will be two webinars to take place in June; and the District is exploring pushing the deadline for the second round call for projects.

#### 4. Public Comment Period

A member of the public noted that Heal the Bay recommends the WASC not fund the Zinc study noting that the funding for the study would not be used to directly reduce stormwater pollution.

#### 5. Discussion Items:

#### a) Ex Parte Communication Disclosures

TJ Moon noted that he has had conversations with Redondo beach on if they are able apply for Safe Clean Water funding for their project.

b) South Santa Monica Bay (SSMB) Project Prioritization and Selection Discussion for populating the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Stormwater Investment Plan - Interactive Planning Tool

Diane Gatza provided an overview of the previous meeting roll call recommendations for which scientific studies were moving forward in the SIP.

Diane Gatza began the process of reviewing each of the individual Infrastructure Projects and to begin roll call recommendations on which projects should or should not be moved forward on the SIP.

John Dettle noted that the dollar amount currently set would be well within a safe margin for planning the next few years of regional funds for the WASC. Susie Santilena noted that it was important for the committee to also consider funding projects so that benefits provided were proportional to the funding raised by individual cities within the watershed.

TJ Moon noted that he supports requesting for design funds to provide seed money for projects, as it allows more municipalities to participate in the regional program.

Susie Santilena noted that the Wilmington Q Street project is located within a disadvantaged community and provides a major water quality and flood mitigation benefit to this area. John Dettle and TJ Moon noted that the committee's largest concern with the project was the cost per treated acre-foot, but that in some areas green street projects are the only available option. The committee decided to keep the Wilmington Q Street project in the SIP.

Kirk Allen clarified that SIPs are not locked in for all 5 years and can be revised in future years. If there are large changes to projects, it may trigger a rescoring process.

The committee decided to keep the two technical resource projects within the SIP.

Diane Gatza requested the committee keep all infrastructure projects within the SIP.

### 6. Public Comment Period

A member of the public inquired if there is a detailed description or scope of work for the watershed coordinator. Kirk Allen noted that the general scope of work for the watershed coordinator will be released for review on May 26.

A member of the public thanked the committee for moving forward the Wilmington Q Street project for consideration into the SIP, noting that the project will help address a major water quality problem and support the community.

Diane Gatza suggested adding a discussion item to discuss the process to replace the environmental community member that has yet to attend a WASC meeting.


### 9. Adjournment


Diane Gatza thanked the committee members and public for their time and participation and adjourned the meeting.
