1. Welcome and Introductions

David Pedersen, Chair of the North Santa Monica Bay WASC, welcomed the WASC members and called the meeting to order. All WASC members made self-introductions and a guorum was established.

Kirk Allen (District) discussed WebEx features and facilitated the roll call. All committee members made self-introductions and a quorum was established.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from May 12, 2021

The District provided a copy of the minutes from the previous meeting. David Pedersen asked the Committee members for comments or revisions.

Mark Johnson made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Chad Christensen seconded the motion. The Committee voted to approve the meeting minutes.

3. Committee Member and District Updates

Kirk Allen (District) provided the District updates, noting: Two Call for Projects info sessions were held and the recordings have been posted on the website. All disbursements have been made out to municipalities. Year One disbursements are being sent out and Second Annual plans are being reviewed to get those dollars received and earmarked for disbursement in either late July or early August. Call for Projects deadline for Round 3 is July 31st. The next Regional Oversight Committee meeting is scheduled for June 29th.



4. Watershed Coordinator Updates

Melina Watts of Melina Sempill Watts Consulting (MSWC), via a slide presentation, shared with the Committee what she learned at the Funding Fair 2021 event held in Sacramento. Of note were the California Grants Portal and the "California Financing Coordinating Committee: Funding Fair Handbook 2021" document. She also noted that the *iBank* and *Economic Development Administration Investment Opportunities* are doing massive lending. Lastly, she advised the Committee to focus on the seven potential strategies for the Strategic Outreach and Engagement Plan and welcomed input for the Vision and Evaluation section.

Madelyn Glickfeld thanked Melina Watts for the work she has done and urged Committee members and alternates to view the Plan Melina is working on.

Tevin Schmitt asked Melina Watts for access to the documents she mentioned in her slide presentation.

5. Public Comment Period

No public comments received.

6. Discussion

a) Ex Parte Communication Disclosure

Joe Bellomo disclosed that the Malibu Creek Watershed Event Group gets together on a regular basis to discuss the development of the update to their plan, which includes projects that were in the application phase or being proposed.

b) Strategic Outreach and Engagement Plan (SOEP)

Melina Watts gave a slide presentation.

Mark Johnson commented that Tik Tok videos are an excellent opportunity to engage a wide variety of people. He also added that the City of Malibu has a media team and graphics artists that might be available to assist with any work.

Kirsten James and Roxanne Hughes expressed appreciation for Melina Watts' presentation.

c) Funding Opportunities

Kirk Allen commented that this item was tied with what Melina Watts provided in the Watershed Coordinator Updates period and is essentially a duplicate.

David Pedersen commented on Senator Henry Stern's expressed interest to support increases in funding for watershed purposes in the North Santa Monica Bay and is also receptive to ensuring it is included in the State Budget Proposal.

David Pedersen asked if the SOEP can be adaptable to changes as new ideas emerge. Kirk Allen answered that since this is the formation year of the program, they might be overly ambitious with some items. Consequently, there will be opportunities to go back and change things as they go along. Melina Watts asked if they could treat the SOEP as a living document which can then be adaptable to change. Kirk Allen answered that it may be treated as a living document given that there will be quarterly updates.



Melina Watts asked for dates the public can participate in as the Committee discusses updates to the SOEP. Kirk Allen answered that it is up to the WASC to decide on which proposed dates they would like to commit to. Melina Watts suggested September 1st as a tentative date. David Pedersen suggested to Melina Watts that she propose a schedule. He also suggested that WASC members be encouraged to attend.

Melina Watts suggested that they form a subcommittee that can support and coordinate with participating members and cities – for instance, in the production of Tik Tok videos – so that everything matches. She suggested that the Committee meet every quarter to discuss developments. Kirk Allen suggested that Melina Watts reach out to cities to coordinate. Melina Watts commented that she will reach out to everyone after the SOEP is approved and see who wants to do what, how, and when.

Roxanne Hughes suggested to Melina Watts that the quarterly late evening community engagement established meetings be held on the third Thursday of the month and the quarter meetings on the second Thursday of the month. Roxanne also expressed interest to be on the subcommittee that Melina Watts wants to set up.

Dave Rydman asked if there are components of the SOEP that can be implemented within Melina Watts' existing budget or if all proposed elements are contingent on additional funding. Melina Watts answered that the conferences would require more money because they are quite expensive. For the films, they might not require additional funding, except for any background music that the Committee may want to add. For the water supply event, if it is films and the cities want to participate in the filmmaking, they can be done with the budget as is. Conferences for the water supply portion would incur additional costs though. Additional funding would also be necessary for the Clean Sweet Film Competition.

Dave Rydman asked if the SOEP can be organized in a way to differentiate between components requiring additional funding and those that can be done with the current budget. Melina Watts answered that that would be a great idea.

Madelyn Glickfeld suggested that the Committee try to get the SOEP ready for the next agenda in July. She also agreed with Dave Rydman that the components should be categorized by those requiring additional funding and those that can be done with the current budget. Madelyn Glickfeld asked attending members to let Melina Watts know whether a specific Thursday evening of the month is <u>not</u> convenient for them.

Bruce Hamamoto asked Melina Watts if the envisioned Thursday evening meetings will be hybrid or inperson. Melina Watts answered that it would be optimal for them to be hybrid. Bruce Hamamoto commented that it would help LA County if they were hybrid.

Tori Klug (Stantec) commented that it might be wise to set a deadline for Committee feedback so that Melina Watts has time to revise and get it over to the District to post on the website in advance of the July meeting. Melina Watts then asked for a two-week turnaround. David Pedersen suggested June 24th as the due date for Committee feedback.

d) RWQCB Conditional Waiver for Trash

Madelyn Glickfeld introduced Alexander Prescott and Jun Zhu from the LA Regional Water Quality Control Board. Alexander Prescott, Lead Environmental Scientist, gave a slide presentation titled, Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Trash from Nonpoint Sources



in Waterbodies Subject to Total Maximum Daily Loads.

Chad Christensen commented that they are pursuing funding as best that they can.

Bruce Hamamoto asked why *Parks and Recreation* is highlighted in blue. Alexander Prescott answered that the blue highlights indicate that they have not submitted TMRPs before, at all.

Danielle LeFer, Senior Environmental Scientist, commented that she can report back regarding this program and follow up on the TMRPs with Alexander Prescott.

David Pedersen asked what the best strategy in the parklands would be to comply with the permits. Jun Zhu answered that it would mainly be trash collection and monitoring.

Madelyn Glickfeld requested for Alexander Prescott and Jun Zhu to set up a meeting with the agencies so that they understand what is expected of them, as well as the timing.


