

First Ever North Santa Monica Bay Watershed Community Meeting: 70 Attendees via Zoom




- Originally imagining this on-site at the Mountain Mermaid Inn, transformed this to a Zoom event.



Public Outreach for Los Angeles County Department of Public Work Liberty Canyon Green Street Project



Facilitated community engagement in support of Los Angeles County Department of Public Works' Liberty Canyon Green Street project for an application due on July 30 with the goal of eliciting community support letters. After conferring with Alberto Grajeda and Josafat Flores from Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, set event for July 15, allowing a week to set up invitations, to issue press releases and to invite the public, to do the event and then to request letters of support for the project. Coordinator reached out to Liberty Canyon Facebook groups (there are two,) on the Next Door app, at the local Patch, via the Agoura Hills City website (thanks to Kelly Fisher) and sent press releases to other venues. Received letters of support from community member Sally Bartel, Rudy C'Dealva, Liberty Canyon HOA president, Dennis Washburn, and Senator Fran Pavley

Met with Debbie Sharpton, consultant, and Jeremy Kerns, the President of the HÓA. Seminole Springs Mobile Home Community. They want to restore the earthen dam + manmade lake at Seminole Springs, provide water supply for fires, some irrigation, and recreation for residents. Project would address public safety (unrestored earthen dam is unsafe in flood conditions) and could create bioswales to capture run-off from the mobile home park before stormwater hits the creek. Upon suggestion by Coordinator, Kerns and Sharpton are exploring developing a phase two creek restoration project to reduce sediment, create bioswale /riparian habitat, and improve afety for bmeowners/downstream sidents. Project would benefit dommunity, much of it low income, but can a project on private land can qualify for Measure W funding?

Document the extent of partnerships and networks you have engaged

- California Watershed Network meetings Suggested Erik Ringelberg, California Director of the Freshwater Trust, (who is interested) as a potential board member for California Watershed Network. Also suggested water rights lawyer Tom Hicks, who declined as he is too busy. CWN provides information about upcoming legislation, funding/grants, and other opportunities to support watersheds in California. CWN wants to better integrate DEI goals values in their work.
- Agoura Hills Animal Shelter Pursued charismatic idea from Tevin Schmitt at Wishtoyo, to do an Adopt a Plant project at Agoura Hills Animal Shelter but AHAS staff did not pursue idea.
- Las Virgenes-Malibu Council of Governments
 Attended LVMCOG on July 20 to share Measure W goals and opportunities with attendees.
- Watershed Coordinator meeting In partnership with Richard Watson, Julie Millet and Adi Liberman, prepared for July 29, Watershed Coordinator meeting. Coordinator's presentation focused on learning lessons with writing (and rewriting) the NSMB SOEP and on suggesting potential collaborative opportunities.
 - Supported Adi Liberman's powerful list of opportunities for watershed coordinators to collaborate on cross- outreach, which should lower costs and lead to a more cohesive outcome.
- Garapito Creek/Topanga Creek Discussed water quality / creek restoration project idea at Garapito Creek/Topanga Creek mainstem: parallel to Viewridge Estates water quality project currently being implemented by Los Angeles County Department of Public Works and discussed other restoration downstream with Chad Christensen and then with Clark Stevens. Project (or projects) would require a willing property owner (or owners) as an opening gambit. Clark envisions a related project at the place where Garapito Creek exits the former Topanga Corral site as it crosses under Topanga Canyon Boulevard in a culvert and enters Edelman Park; this would also require a willing property owner.
- Liberty Canyon Agoura Hills community members have expressed interest in a potential expansion of Los Angeles County Flood Control Liberty Canyon Storm Drain water quality project into a cross-agency collaboration leading to a potential creek restoration project. This concept led to reaching out to stakeholders and setting a city / agency meeting for September 14, 2021 (subsequently rescheduled to 11/3/2021.)
- Bermuda Stepped Limestone Roof + Cistern Project Emailed Darla Miller at Topanga Community House about roof / cistern idea and pitched concept to a friend who works with the Hilton Foundation, but her boss declined to allow her to forward the idea. Susan Nissman thinks this concept could get traction at Topanga Elementary School. Invited Amy Weisberg, Kindergarten teacher and chair of Topanga Elementary School Safety, Environment and Climate Committee to meet to discuss, also reached out to Dr. Alisa Land Hill, a parent who is working on the science program at TES about potential stepped roof / cistern project.

Fog Catchers



Summary of Leverage Funding Pursuits

- Explored the possibility of the upcoming Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission Proposition 50 grant program at the request of Alex Farassati, City of Calabasas; the opportunity is specifically for water quality centered scientific research. No projects in place currently that match the opportunity.
- Connected with Laurie Montoya to request more capacity the next time the California Funding Fair is hosted, as 11 out of 12 watershed coordinators were not able to register because events were at capacity and had no more room for would-be attendees.
 - Shared California Funders' Fair brochure with stakeholders and with other coordinators.
- Co-wrote grant for Supervisorial District 3 with Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, TreePeople and Treetrust to help fund Native Plants Kit project to reduce water use / reduce fertilizer use / decrease erosion; note that the ask is about 5% of the need for the entire project, but is a start.

Engagement Efforts Benefitting Disadvantaged Communities

- Asked leadership at STANTEC for an event to educate coordinators about how best to work with the technical advisory teams.
- In partnership with Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, TreePeople and TreeTrust tried to collaborate with Santa Monica Mountains Fund to provide financial support for their BIPOC low-income interns who are learning from and working for nursery manager Antonio Sanchez at the native plants nursery at the National Parks Service facility at Satwiwa.
- Terry Dipple and coordinator have been discussing how supporting work to address homelessness and water quality interrelate, including intriguing art / housing funding partnerships.
- Coordinator spoke with Tevin Schmitt at Wishtoyo about the possibility of installing one or more fogcatchers at Wishtoyo Village atop the cliffs in Malibu.
- Considering projects that may require Technical Assistance Teams, Seminole Springs certainly has community interest but may or may not be eligible as the HOA is part of a for-profit business.
- Coordinator continues to advocate for swimming literacy for BIPOC students in Los Angeles County; swimming literacy is integral to students' future ability to work with – and in – and for – water.

Scheduling Concerns or Issues

- Once the North Santa Monica Bay Watershed Strategic Outreach and Engagement Plan was approved by the North Santa Monica Bay Watershed Advisory Steering Committee on August 12, 2021, this completely opened up time for the watershed coordinator program.

 - Coordinator will spend a day in Topanga with Terri Alex, Los Angeles County Waterworks District 29 to help her connect with the community so as to best support water conservation outreach in Topanga.
- Coordinator will persist in setting a meeting with Clark Stevens and Seminole Springs advocates Debra Sharpton and Jeremy Kerns.
- Exosia is new alternative to Google that funds forest growth; coordinator will explore if this a orce for funding for work in NSMB watershed.
- Next NSMBW Community meeting is set for January. Coordinator will explore the idea of dong a pre-filmed tour of the Pure Water Project demonstration site, will reach out to Eastern Municipal Water District to hear from them about their proactive water conservation / legislation work and will reach out to Dr. Brian Fagan to learn about effective (and ineffective) drought management techniques throughout history.
