#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

District Staff and Gina Nila, Chair of the Lower Los Angeles River (LLAR) WASC, welcomed all Committee Members.

District Staff conducted a brief tutorial on WebEx, provided an overview of meeting guidelines and participation instructions, and facilitated the roll call of Committee Members. A quorum was established.

#### 2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from August 23, 2022

District Staff presented the meeting minutes from the previous meeting. Member Adriana Figueroa motioned to approve the meeting minutes from August 23, 2022. Member Madeline Chen seconded. The Committee approved the meeting minutes with fifteen votes in favor, zero opposed, and one abstention (approved, see vote tracking sheet).

#### 3. Committee Member and District Updates

District Staff provided an update, noting:

• The Board of Supervisors announced that the board hearing at the Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration will reopen to the public on September 27, 2022. The District will continue to

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prepare for the transition to potential in-person WASC meetings. Also on September 27, 2022, the Board of Supervisors extended Assembly Bill 361, which authorizes public committees to meet without complying with all the teleconferencing requirements of the Brown Act when the situation warrants it and thus allows to continue to meet virtually.

- The Round 4 Call for Projects for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 (FY23-24) closed on July 31, 2022. District Staff has conducted completeness checks for the received projects. The preliminary count of applications is as follows: 33 Infrastructure Program (IP), 4 Scientific Study (SS), and 4 Technical Resource Program (TRP) applicants. In this WASC 2 IPs and 1 SS were received.
- All nine Stormwater Investment Plans (SIPs) were approved by the Regional Oversight Committee for advancement to the Board for approval. The Board meeting is scheduled for October 4, 2022.
- Attending meetings regularly is a requirement for WASC members under Article 5 of the WASC Operating Guidelines. An absence of two consecutive meetings or more than three meetings in one year will be considered failure to attend meetings and may result in the absentee member's removal from the WASC. If attendance by the Primary member is not possible for a particular meeting, it is requested that the Alternate Member be present at the meeting.
- Every Committee Member is required to fill out Form 700. A Form 700 is required when a member is assuming office for the first time (part of the onboarding process), continuing to serve on a committee (annual requirement), leaving a committee (part of the offboarding process), or changing roles within the committee. District Staff will contact individuals who need to fill out these forms.

#### 4. Watershed Coordinator Updates

Watershed Coordinator Tara Dales provided an update covering activity during the first quarter of FY 22-23, for the months of April, May, and June, including highlights of the community survey results and focusing on understanding community needs. An overview of the stakeholder meetings and presentations, and community events held and planned was given, pertaining to the focus areas of soliciting new projects and raising public awareness. The Washington Boulevard Stormwater and Urban Diversion Project was discussed as a case study for public-private partnerships. Lastly, Watershed Coordinator Dales highlighted the Redesign LA Funding database as a tool to identify active funding opportunities from public sources and private philanthropy. #### 5. Public Comment Period

District Staff compiled all public comment cards received by 5:00pm the day before the meeting. No comment cards were received before the meeting. There were no public comments.

#### 6. Discussion Items

#### a. Ex Parte Communication Disclosure

There were no ex parte communication disclosures.

# b. Discuss to send none, some, or all completed feasibility studies to Scoring Committee for consideration

To provide context for this item, District Staff explained that typically, after completeness checks, all the feasibility studies received were sent to the Scoring Committee. Due to limited funding and the high number

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of projects received in some WASCs, a WASC may select some, all, or none of the IPs to send to the Scoring Committee. The LLAR WASC has two IPs. From what District Staff has observed, no WASCs have decided not to send any of their IPs to the Scoring Committee.

Watershed Coordinator Dales shared a summary of the Spane Park Infrastructure Project, including details on elements and benefits of the project. Spane Park has a self-score of 89 and consists of the construction of a regional stormwater capture and infiltration facility beneath existing park surface.

Watershed Coordinator Dales provided an overview of the Long Beach Municipal Urban Stormwater Treatment (LB MUST) Infrastructure Project. Phase 2 of this project consists of constructing a new park with a pump station and cistern and connecting 5 existing pump stations to the LB MUST facility. The project has a self-score of 73. The benefits of the project were discussed.

District Staff clarified that the scores presented are self-assessed scores through project modules. As mentioned, WASCs now have the option to send some, all, or none of the received projects to the Scoring Committee, where those sent will receive an official score.

#### 7. Public Comment Period

There were no public comments.

#### 8. Voting Items

 Vote to send none, some, or all completed feasibility studies to Scoring Committee for consideration

Member Kristen Ruffell motioned to send both IPs to the Scoring Committee for consideration. The motion was seconded by Member Melissa Bahmanpour. The Committee voted to approve the motion with sixteen votes in favor and zero opposed (approved, see vote tracking sheet).

#### 9. Items for Next Agenda

District Staff suggests hearing the presentations for the two IPs and one SS all next month, since the holidays will be approaching the following months and this WASC has only three total presentations. It would be recommended to extend the meeting for an additional half hour.

Members discussed potential conflicts with different suggested dates and times, as they consider the California Stormwater Quality Association Conference, other WASC meetings and the items for the next agenda.

Agenda topics include:

- a. Update from GAP analysis
- b. Presentations for the received IPs and SSs
- c. Regional Program Quarterly Report Summary FY21-22 Q1 and Q2

It is decided to hold the next meeting on Tuesday November 1, 2022, 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm, contingent upon the GAP analysis presenter's availability. See the SCWP website for meeting details.
